



# The changes made since consultation (Autumn 24)

## Teddington DRA – Design Changes following consultation 2023

- Non-statutory consultation and stakeholder engagement feedback has led to a re-evaluation of our design and an investigation into the feasibility of
  alternative ways to construct TDRA to help address key concerns around potential construction impacts on local communities.
- Key design changes confirmed in May 2024 are to the recycled water conveyance which includes:
  - constructing a 3.5m ID tunnel rather than a 1.8m ID pipeline
  - using a Tunnel Boring Machine rather than pipejacking methods
- These changes mean:
  - A slightly shorter tunnel from Mogden to the River Thames
  - Removal of four intermediate shafts and construction compounds from the project at:
    - Ivybridge Retail Park Car Park within Hounslow
    - Moormead and Bandy Recreation Ground within Richmond
    - Land to the west of Riverside Drive Playground within Richmond
    - Ham Lands, west of Riverside Drive within Richmond
  - Removal means no above ground construction within these areas impacting on local communities.
  - A single intermediate shaft is still required preferred location is on 'Land at Ham Playing Fields' off Ham Street within Richmond
  - All tunnel material would be handled and removed from Mogden STW rather than from any shaft along the conveyance route.
  - Sweetening flow when not operational will be diverted to Isleworth AIT 15 MLD/25% of 75 MLD (TBC)

RE: Underground works for the Teddington Direct River Abstraction project.

As you may be aware, we've been developing proposals for a new water rec Hounslow, Richmond and Kingston. The project, known as "Teddington Dire Abstraction" (TDRA), would combine existing water infrastructure with new tippelines and other infrastructure, to provide additional water supplies during dry weather. You're receiving this letter as we believe that property or rights that you have a kap may be affected by our proposals for the TDRA project.

Last year, we held a public consultation on our initial proposed site options, focusing on the potential locations of the new shafts and other structures that would be needed. Since then, we've made several changes to our designs.

We've identified a corridor between Mogden Sewage Treatment Works (TW7 7LW) and the River Thames, within which we're proposing to construct a new tunnel, deep underground (between 20m and 30m from the surface of the ground to the top of the tunnel).


We've identified that your legal interest is located within the proposed route corridor for the new tunnel. Our proposals are at an early stage, and the corridor we have identified is larger than will be required for the final design, so this doesn't mean a tunnel will necessarily be beneath your property. Some of the corridor may only be needed during construction phase and will therefore not be needed on a permanent basis.

We appreciate that the contents of this letter will prompt many questions and may be concerning for you, so we have prepared more information about our tunnelling proposal which is available on our website, via <a href="www.thames-sro.co.uk/TDRA">www.thames-sro.co.uk/TDRA</a>.

We are keen to discuss the proposals with you and invite you to join us at one of the community information events we are holding, where you can come and speak to us about the contents of this letter, and what it means for you:

## Key Themes of Discussion

Across all events, similar discussion points were raised by attendees. The major themes included:

#### Mogden STW and Local Construction Impacts

Concerns about the volume of spoil, HGV traffic, and the effect on ongoing operations at Mogden, particularly in terms of odour control.

#### Land and Property Concerns

Discussion around the potential of property damage from tunnelling, particularly regarding subsidence. Attendees also raised concerns about declining property values and compulsory purchase orders (CPOs) for affected properties.

#### Water Quality

Discussions around impacts on water quality in the Thames, particularly the Thames Tideway Tunnel (TTF) and existing discharges at Isleworth Ait.

#### Visual Impact on Riverside Areas

Conversations about how the project could affect the aesthetics of their local area.






MM of Rainfall at Heathrow




#### Average of Total NH4 load kg by Year, Quarter and Month




## Tonnes of RAG removed from Crude Sewage


#### Total O2 Demand - Decreasing




